- ☐ Complete the [WCU International Undergraduate Application](#).
- ☐ Send a copy of your passport photo page.
- ☐ Send unofficial copies of your transcript(s) in English.
- ☐ To demonstrate English proficiency, you must take the TOEFL (Internet-Based: 75, Paper-Based: 537), IELTS (6.0 Overall), DuoLingo English Test (95), PTE Academic (50), or provide a letter from your international office stating that you meet our English proficiency requirements.
- ☐ Send a [certificate of financial responsibility form](#) showing a minimum of \$8,593 USD of support per semester. Please attach any bank letters or statements proving the funds.
- ☐ Lastly, we will need any current or previous U.S. visas, I-20s, or I-94s. (**NOTE:** This is not required... Only if you have them.)

Application Deadlines

Fall Term (August-December) Early Deadline: March 1*
Fall Term (August-December) Regular Deadline: April 1
Spring Term (January-May) Deadline: October 1

*Students can begin to register for classes online in mid-March. Classes can fill up quickly; therefore, this deadline is preferable to ensure better chances of securing your courses. However, April 1 is the absolute deadline.

Pay tuition as an exchange student with Direct Enrollment:

Full-Time Course Load: 12 Credit Hours

The average course load per semester is 12-15 credit hours, typically equivalent to about 4-5 classes (15 Credit Hours = 30 ECTS).

Finances

As mentioned in the checklist above, you must fill out the **certificate of finances form**. Students must be able to pay their total costs for their first semester by 5:00 PM on the first Friday of classes.

Room and Board

On-Campus Housing: WCU has 14 different residence halls on campus that serve different student populations and offer various amenities. (Exchange students must live on campus.) Students that plan to stay on-campus over winter break (mid-December to mid-January), must choose Robertson as their residence hall. Winter break housing costs around \$23 a day. Dining options are limited during that time.
