Learn about Humanity in God's Image alongside Christian scholars from around the world

“Humanity created in God’s image—and the church as the renewed imago Dei—is called and empowered to be God’s multi-sided prism in the world, reflecting and refracting the Creator’s brilliant light into a rainbow of cultural activity and socio-political patterns that scintillates with the glory of God’s presence and manifests his reign of justice.” J. Though Scripture doesn’t elaborate often on its meaning, this key phrase—imago Dei—has played an important role in theological reflection on the place of humanity in God’s world. Join a cohort of scholars to explore implications of this important teaching across a range of disciplines and tasks in academic life.

During this Reflecting Faith course, you will:

- Explore what Scripture says and suggests about humanity as God’s image-bearing creature.
- Examine recent theological proposals about the meaning and implications of the “image” and thus the meaning and call of the human community.
- Evaluate applications of the imago Dei in the work of scholars outside of the field of theology.
- Develop ideas about how the conviction that humanity is created in God’s image might inform your own work in higher education.
